Section 436(63) of the FNCRR 2017 includes dredging of boulder from river bed using excavator which is not within the ambit of FNCA 1995 and the definition of surface collection specified in the Joint Guidelines issued in 2010 by then Cabinet. Existence of such overlapping mandates created difficulties in implementation and monitoring by the relevant agencies. It has also contributed to unrestrained surface collections and dredging of RBM by private parties and non-compliance to applicable Laws and Regulations governing the surface collections. RAA's review noticed that while almost all the parties were involved in dredging activities, Environmental Clearance was not obtained from the NEC except by M/S BMML Enterprise. In few cases, the Environmental Clearance was obtained from DoFPS which is not the competent authority for issuance for Environmental Clearance for dredging activities.
